Funded to date with your contributions:

- New station planning: preliminary analysis for our new headquarters station on Woodside Road.
- Expanded fire prevention: a second chipper and truck to expand the fuel reduction program and an expanded smoke alarm program to targeted neighborhoods.
- Improved emergency medical services: the most up-to-date cardiac monitor/defibrillators enabling paramedics to provide consistent all-life support (ALS) from all vehicles.
- Improved incident planning and response: iPads on all vehicles for route mapping, pre-incident plans and responses, and inspections; backpack vacuums for recovery from severe weather and flooding; an emergency response vehicle and trailer for off-road and trail rescue; technical rescue equipment for car accidents; and equipment for large animal rescue.
- Expanded public education and training: a vehicle and trailer complete with AV system, enabling Woodside Fire to bring essential training directly to your neighborhood; state-of-the-art CPR training manikins and materials; and a specialized "After-the-Incident" booklet for residents recovering from natural disaster or medical emergency.
- Improved firefighter safety: specialized washers for cleaning firefighters' protective clothing.
