Recent Impact of Your Contributions

- Expanded fire prevention: The launch of the fire district's Fire Adapted Community (FAC) program, under the direction of Deputy Fire Marshal Don Bullard, helps you improve your home's survival and family's safety during a wildfire. FAC offers information and specific actions you can take to protect homes built in the "wildland-urban interface" fire zone, the area where our residential development is next to or surrounded by wildlands.
- Improved emergency medical services: The deployment of three state-of-theart cardiac monitor/defibrillators enables paramedics to provide consistent alllife support (ALS) from all vehicles. These systems upload data directly from the ambulance to the emergency room, saving precious time and ensuring that the hospital ER team is even better prepared to receive the patient.
- Improved incident planning and response: With the roll-out of its advanced IT-based preplan emergency response program, fire department personnel have critical information about buildings and structures at their fingertips before they arrive at the scene of an incident.
- Expanded public education and training: Successful wildfire evacuation drills, organized and run by Woodside Fire, prepared your neighborhoods for the worst-case scenario and equipped you with potentially lifesaving skills, knowledge and readiness.
- **Improved firefighter safety:** The installation of specialized extractor units was completed at Headquarters Station 7.
